This seminar will examine Congolese ethnographies and historiography with a wide lens, considering work since the days of Mary Douglas and Jan Vansina in the 1950s and in light of the genres of historical anthropology, ethnographic history, visual history, and the like. The series of lectures will speak to key generations, practitioners, concepts, themes, and lacunae. The implications of heuristics and methods from my own publications and ongoing research will be underlined. Yet it is in investigating current scholarship of a few seasoned and especially junior scholars and constellations, that we may glimpse promise, voids, and futures—likely and unlikely, needed and desired.
